### Garden Shows and Floral Classes

Garden shows (called Parlour shows) allow members to show what they grow and most are judged. Members enter flowers, fruits and vegetables from their gardens plus floral art arrangements.

### Garden Tours

Our Program Directors arrange a number of outings during the year, especially in July and August to view public gardens such as Darts Hill and The Glades, nurseries or other facilities as well as tours of member gardens.
