CLASS DESCRIPTION

1	Dahlia Giant Decorative or Cactus – over 10” – 1 bloom
2	Dahlia Large Decorative or Cactus – 8 – 10” 1 bloom
3	Dahlia Medium Decorative or Cactus – 6-8” – 1 bloom
4	Dahlia Small Decorative 4-6” bloom
5	Dahlia incurved Cactus any size -1 bloom
6	Dahlia lacinated any size- 1 bloom
7	Dahlia miniature 2-1/2-4” 1 bloom
8	Dahlia Ball 4-6”1 bloom
9	Dahlia Ball 2-4” 1 bloom
10	Dahlia Pompon under 2” 1 bloom
11	Dahlia Waterlily any size – 1 bloom
12	Any other dahlia, not listed – 1 bloom – Anemone, Orchid, Collarette, Steller or Peony
13	Collection of 5 – 7 Dahlia blooms in a vase, c.v.a.
14	your favourite Dahlia (Name and type) 1bloom
15	Zinnia c.v.a.- 3stems
16	Cosmos c.v.a. 3 stems
17	Grasses c.v.a. 3 cuts
18	Any other flower – 3 stems
19	Nasturtiums c.v.a. 5 stems (show with leaves)
20	Planted oriental cabbage or kale plant.

FLORAL ART – NOVICE

21	ALL AROUND MY HAT – Decorate a hat using dried flowers and ribbons
22	SALT & PEPPER – a black and white design – get crafty with this one
23	FLORAL WREATH – use flowers and greenery plus a surprise!

FLORAL ART – ADVANCED

24	BEACHCOMBER WREATH – tiny pieces of driftwood, shells, moss, dried plants that grow at the beach
25	ALL AROUND MY HAT – use dried flowers and ribbons
26	ORIENTAL SIMPLICITY – branches and a few flowers
27	MY FAVOURITE DESIGN – this is monochromatic, use flowers that are all hues of one colour (light to dark tones i.e. all oranges, all blue etc.)
